

Valenco*Insights*Income Change survey 2018

Results of survey conducted in June 2018 by Valenco Inc.

In its 2nd Income Change survey, Valenco asked respondents to share the impact on their income when changing jobs or staying on with the same company in the last 3 years.

A majority of responses were received from USA and Canada and with a high % of respondents from IT sales & delivery professions.

1. Change in actual income

Incomes in the last two years rose for 74% of those who changed jobs and for 92% of those who stayed on with their present organization.

Those who made a job change had mores instances of income increases of 10% or higher and also of lower income than what they made in their prior job.

2. Job change trend

60% of the respondents had changed jobs in the last 3 years, a dip from the 73% in the 2016 survey, with a sharp dip in job changes by respondents outside the USA/Canada.

3. Income change for those who changed jobs

74% of those changing jobs saw their actual incomes increase and 26% saw flat or lower income – a sharp contrast from 2016 when 100% of those changing jobs saw income rising. The change was more visible in India and among those outside IT services sales

4. Pay package for those changing jobs

78% of the respondents who had changed jobs in the last 3 years received a better pay package. There was a dip in occurrence of package increases in India and for non IT sales professions compared to the 2016 survey.
