

Results of survey conducted in July 2022 by Valenco Inc.

In its 4th Income Change survey, Valenco asked respondents if their income had changed in the last 2 years, by how much and if they had changed jobs in the last 3 years or continued with their employer.

A majority of responses were received from USA and Canada and from respondents working in IT services.

Highlights

- In the last 2 years, 93% of the respondents saw their actual income increase, a jump from the 78% in the 2020 survey.
- The increase response was similar across geo's, professions and experience ranges
- In the past 6 years, progressively more of those in staff functions have got income boosts, with 100% seeing a bump in the past 2 years. A similar trend for those in IT delivery. This may be a reflection of increasing demand for talent in staff functions and IT delivery.
- 91% (85% in the 2020 survey). of those which stayed with their employers the past 3 years saw income increase in the last 2 years
- In comparison, 96% (72% in the 2020 survey) who changed jobs in the last 3 years had an income boost. This is the first time in the last 6 years that more people changing jobs saw income rising compared to those staying on.
- Stable employees had a lower income increase in the past 2 years compared to when we surveyed in 2020.
 This may also be a result of the Covid year salary corrections.
- In contrast, 71% of those changing jobs saw income boosts of 20% or higher a reflection of the war for talent. In past surveys, the 20% or higher boosts were to 40 45% of the job changers.
- Surprisingly though, only 42% of the respondents mentioned having changed jobs the last 3 years, which was a
 drop from the 60% level in the past two surveys (Maybe a Covid hunker down in 2020 followed by jump in mid2021 and 2022?)
- There was a big jump in job changes in the 15–20-year experience group, an increase in the less than 15-year experience group but in contrast a drop in the 20+ experience group.

1. Change in income in the last 2 years

In the last 2 years, actual income increased for 93% of the respondents. These was the highest since we started the surveys in 2016.

65% respondents indicated income increase of 10% or more compared to 60% in the 2020 survey and 54% in the 2018 survey.

2. Job change trend

42% of the respondents had changed jobs in the last 3 years, a drop from previous surveys, with the 20+ year experience group being the most stable.

3. The impact of switching jobs on income

91% of those who stayed with the same company the last 3 years saw an increase in their income in the last 2 years as compared to 96% of those who changed companies.
